### Coping in an Uncertain World: Students' Thoughts on Safety, Conflicts, and Homeland Security

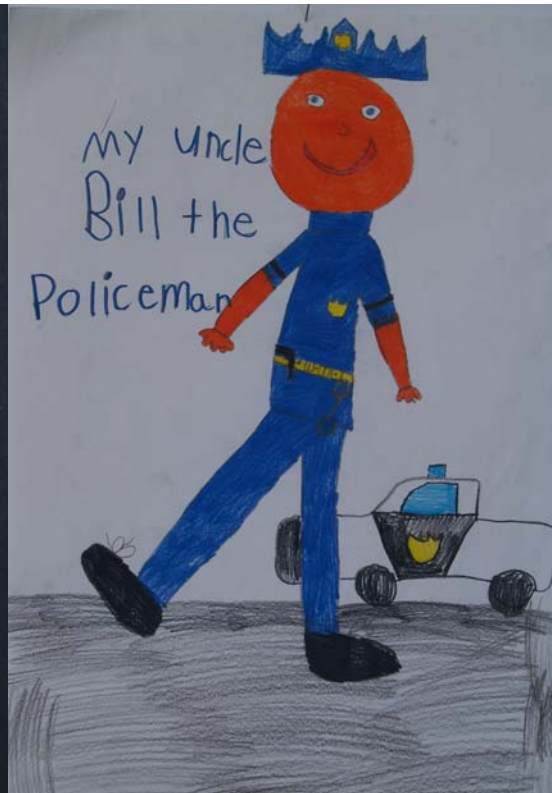
Join the Connecticut Commission on Children, the Department of Education, and the Department of Emergency Management and Homeland Security for a presentation of student writing and artwork from across the state.
