"An Act Concerning Certification And Background Checks For Home Health Aides And Background Checks For Emergency Medical Technicians, For Certain Caregivers And For Nursing Home Employment."

1 After section 14, add the following and renumber the remaining
2 section accordingly:

3 "Sec. 15. Subsection (a) of section 31-277 of the general statutes is
4 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof:

5 (a) Each commissioner shall, during his first year of service as a
6 commissioner, receive an annual salary of six thousand dollars less
7 than the highest step level of a Superior Court judge; during his second
8 year of service as a commissioner, each commissioner shall receive an
9 annual salary of five thousand dollars less than the highest step level
10 of a Superior Court judge; during his third year of service as a
11 commissioner, he shall receive an annual salary of four thousand

12 dollars less than the highest step level of a Superior Court judge;
13 during his fourth year of service as a commissioner, he shall receive an
14 annual salary of three thousand dollars less than the highest step level
15 of a Superior Court judge; during his fifth year of service as a
16 commissioner, he shall receive an annual salary of two thousand
17 dollars less than the highest step level of a Superior Court judge; and
18 during his sixth year of service as a commissioner, he shall receive an
19 annual salary of one thousand dollars less than the highest step level of
20 a Superior Court judge, together with his necessary clerical, office and
21 travel expenses as approved by the Comptroller; and the chairman of
22 the Workers' Compensation Commission shall receive in addition
23 [one] ten thousand dollars annually. Each commissioner shall devote
24 his entire time to the duties of his office and shall not be otherwise
25 gainfully employed."
