"An Act Concerning The Authorization Of Bonds Of The State For Capital Improvements And Other Purposes."

1 Strike section 2 in its entirety and substitute the following in lieu
2 thereof:

3 "Sec. 2. The proceeds of the sale of said bonds, to the extent
4 hereinafter stated, shall be used for the purpose of acquiring, by
5 purchase or condemnation, undertaking, constructing, reconstructing,
6 improving or equipping or purchasing land or buildings or improving
7 sites for the projects hereinafter described, including payment of
8 architectural, engineering, demolition or related costs in connection
9 therewith, or of payment of the cost of long-range capital
10 programming and space utilization studies as hereinafter stated:

11 (a) For the Military Department: Improvements and renovations to
12 the West Hartford Armory, including renovations in accordance with
13 current codes, not exceeding \$1,000,000.

14 (b) For The University of Connecticut:

15 (1) Development of a new downtown campus for The University of
16 Connecticut in Waterbury in accordance with the provisions of public
17 act 95-230, not exceeding \$10,000,000;

18 (2) Development of a new downtown campus for The University of
19 Connecticut in Waterbury in accordance with the provisions of public
20 act 95-230, provided the Department of Higher Education has
21 approved the expansion of the bachelor's and master's degree
22 programs in business, at the Waterbury campus, not exceeding
23 \$10,000,000.

24 (c) For the Connecticut State University System:

25 (1) At Central Connecticut State University:

26 (A) Development of an energy center to replace the existing power
27 plant, including the demolition and removal of old equipment and
28 structures, modifications to existing power house and installation of
29 underground utility tunnel system, not exceeding \$7,620,000;

30 (B) Renovations and improvements to Copernicus Hall, including
31 heating, ventilating and air conditioning system and code
32 improvements, not exceeding \$13,300,000;

33 (C) Renovations and improvements to Willard and DiLoreto Halls,
34 and an in-fill addition, not exceeding \$2,827,000;

35 (D) New Admissions Center, not exceeding \$800,000;

36 (E) Various site improvements associated with the closure of Wells
37 Street, including the installation of tunnels and upgrade of utilities
38 including the primary electrical system, steam and condensate lines,
39 chilled water lines and communication lines, not exceeding \$2,899,000;

40 (F) Development of athletic and practice fields and related
41 improvements, not exceeding \$2,300,000;

- 42 (2) At Eastern Connecticut State University:
- 43 (A) Roof replacement at Media Hall, Goddard Hall and the North
44 Heating Plant, not exceeding \$1,369,000;
- 45 (B) Renovations and additions to the J.E. Smith Library building for
46 administrative office space, including window and roof replacement,
47 structural repairs, and ADA elevator and bathroom improvements, not
48 exceeding \$2,160,000;
- 49 (3) At Western Connecticut State University: Relocation of football
50 field and associated facilities from the Midtown Campus to the West
51 Side Campus, not exceeding \$447,000;
- 52 (4) At Southern Connecticut State University: Renovations and
53 expansion of Engleman Hall, not exceeding \$4,794,000.
- 54 (d) For the Regional Community-Technical College System: For the
55 Capital Community Technical College, development of consolidated
56 facilities, not exceeding \$3,200,000.
- 57 (e) For the Department of Children and Families: Development of
58 community residential facilities for juvenile offenders, including
59 acquisition of land and/or buildings, not exceeding \$9,000,000."
