The Committee on Judiciary reported through REP. LAWLOR of the 99<sup>th</sup> Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the House, that the bill ought to pass.

***An Act Concerning The Criminal Liability Of An Individual For Conduct Performed In The Name Of Or In Behalf Of A Limited Liability Company.***

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 53a-11 of the general statutes is repealed and the following  
2 is substituted in lieu thereof:

3 A person shall be criminally liable for conduct constituting an  
4 offense which [he] such person performs or causes to be performed in  
5 the name of or in behalf of a corporation or limited liability company  
6 to the same extent as if such conduct were performed in [his] such  
7 person's own name or behalf.

***AN ACT CONCERNING THE CRIMINAL LIABILITY OF AN INDIVIDUAL FOR CONDUCT PERFORMED IN THE NAME OF OR IN BEHALF OF A LIMITED LIABILITY COMPANY.***

**SUMMARY:**

This bill makes a person criminally liable for conduct he performs or causes to be performed in the name of or in behalf of a limited liability company to the same extent as if the conduct were performed in his own name or behalf.
