The Committee on Finance, Revenue and Bonding reported through REP. MCDONALD of the 148th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the House, that the bill ought to pass.

An Act Concerning Notary Public Fees.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Section 3-95 of the general statutes is repealed and the
2 following is substituted in lieu thereof:

3 The fee for any act performed by a notary public in accordance with
4 the provisions of the general statutes shall not exceed [two] five dollars
5 plus an additional [twenty-five] thirty-five cents for each mile of travel.

6 Sec. 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2000.

OLR Bill Analysis

HB 5689

AN ACT CONCERNING NOTARY PUBLIC FEES.

SUMMARY:

This bill increases the fee and mileage reimbursement that a notary public can charge for his services. It raises the limit on the fee for any act the notary performs from \$2 to \$5, and the charge for each mile traveled goes from 25 cents to 35 cents.
