Senate Bill No. 628

*Senate, April 11, 2000*

The Committee on Appropriations reported through SEN. CRISCO of the 17<sup>th</sup> Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the bill ought to pass.

***An Act Concerning Expenditures For The Departments Of Administrative Services And Public Works And The State Properties Review Board.***

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (NEW) The Commissioner of Administrative Services  
2 shall review the functions and activities of the department in order to  
3 assess the cost-effectiveness of such functions and activities and assign  
4 priority for their continued funding. The commissioner shall submit  
5 findings and recommendations to the joint standing committee of the  
6 General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to  
7 appropriations and the budgets of state agencies not later than January  
8 10, 2001, and annually thereafter.

9 Sec. 2. (NEW) The Commissioner of Public Works shall review the  
10 functions and activities of the department in order to assess the  
11 cost-effectiveness of such functions and activities and assign priority  
12 for their continued funding. The commissioner shall submit findings

13 and recommendations to the joint standing committee of the General  
14 Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to appropriations and  
15 the budgets of state agencies not later than January 10, 2001, and  
16 annually thereafter.

17 Sec. 3. (NEW) The chairperson of the State Properties Review Board  
18 shall review the functions and activities of the board in order to assess  
19 the cost-effectiveness of such functions and activities and assign  
20 priority for their continued funding. The chairperson shall submit  
21 findings and recommendations to the joint standing committee of the  
22 General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to  
23 appropriations and the budgets of state agencies not later than January  
24 10, 2001, and annually thereafter.

The passage of this bill would not result in a fiscal impact to the state. It requires the Commissioner of the Department of Administrative Services, the Commissioner of the Department of Public Works, and the Chairperson of the State Properties Review Board to review the functions and activities of their agencies in order to assess their cost-effectiveness and assign priority for their continued funding. It also requires them to submit findings and recommendations to the Appropriations Committee by January 10, 2001, and annually thereafter. State agencies already report to the Appropriations Committee on an annual basis to review their functions and activities.

**AN ACT CONCERNING EXPENDITURES FOR THE DEPARTMENTS OF ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES AND PUBLIC WORKS AND THE STATE PROPERTIES REVIEW BOARD.****SUMMARY:**

The bill requires (1) the Commissioner of Administrative Services, (2) the Commissioner of Public Works, and (3) the chairperson of the State Properties Review Board to review the functions and activities of their agencies in order to assess the cost-effectiveness of such functions and activities and assign priority for their continued funding. They are required to submit findings and recommendations to the Appropriations Committee not later than January 10, 2001, and annually thereafter.
