1 In line 89, strike "Notwithstanding the provisions of"

2 Strike lines 90 to 98, inclusive, in their entirety and insert "Upon
3 conviction of such person for such violations, the commissioner shall
4 transfer such property to the Bureau of Identification of the Division of
5 State Police, within the Department of Public Safety, for disposal
6 pursuant to section 54-36e of the general statutes, as amended by this
7 act."

8 After line 202, insert the following:

9 "Sec. 6. Section 54-36e of the general statutes is repealed and the
10 following is substituted in lieu thereof:

11 (a) Except as provided in sections 26-85 and 26-90, firearms [,] or
12 weapons adjudged by the court to be contraband pursuant to
13 subsection (c) of section 54-36a, or adjudicated a nuisance pursuant to
14 section 54-33g, shall be turned over to the Bureau of Identification of
15 the [Connecticut] Division of State Police, within the Department of

16 Public Safety, for destruction or appropriate use or disposal by sale at
17 public auction.

18 (b) Firearms or weapons turned over to the state police pursuant to
19 subsection (a) of this section [which] that are not destroyed or retained
20 for appropriate use shall be sold at public auctions, conducted by the
21 Commissioner of Administrative Services or [his] the commissioner's
22 designee. Pistols and revolvers, as defined in section 53a-3, [which]
23 that are antiques, as defined in section 29-33, or curios or relics, as
24 defined in the Code of Federal Regulations, Title 27, Chapter 1, Part
25 178, or modern pistols and revolvers [which] that have a current retail
26 value of one hundred dollars or more may be sold at such public
27 auctions, provided such pistols and revolvers shall be sold only to
28 persons who have a valid permit to sell a pistol or revolver, or a valid
29 permit to carry a pistol or revolver, issued pursuant to section 29-28.
30 Rifles and shotguns, as defined in section 53a-3, shall be sold only to
31 persons qualified under federal law to purchase such rifles and
32 shotguns. The proceeds of any such sale shall be paid to the State
33 Treasurer and [by him] deposited in the General Fund."
