1 After line 457, insert the following and renumber the following
2 section accordingly:

3 "Sec. 3. Subsection (a) of section 17b-749k of the general statutes is
4 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof:

5 (a) On and after January 1, 1998, the Commissioner of Social
6 Services shall, within available appropriations, request a criminal
7 history records check for any person, other than a relative, providing
8 child care services to a child in the child's home who receives a child
9 care subsidy from the Department of Social Services. [Such] When
10 such criminal history records check [shall be] is requested, [from] the
11 commissioner shall require such person to furnish to the commissioner
12 a full set of fingerprints to enable a criminal history record check to be
13 conducted. The commissioner shall submit the complete set of finger

14 prints to the State Police Bureau of Identification, [and the Federal
15 Bureau of Investigation.] The State Police Bureau of Identification is
16 authorized to submit the fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of
17 Investigations for a national criminal history record check. The
18 commissioner shall also request a check of the state child abuse
19 registry established pursuant to section 17a-101k. A fee shall be
20 charged by the commissioner for each such national criminal history
21 records check which shall be equal to the fee charged by the Federal
22 Bureau of Investigation for performing such check. The Department of
23 Social Services shall reimburse the Department of Public Safety for the
24 actual cost for a national criminal history records check."
