***"An Act Concerning High School Diplomas And
Veterans Of World War II."***

1 After line 58, add the following and renumber the remaining section
2 accordingly:

3 "Sec. 2. Any person whose moral and educational qualifications have
4 been approved by the committee on recommendations for admission for
5 the county in which such person has made application for admission to
6 the bar prior to October 1, 1991, and who has served honorably in the
7 armed forces of the United States for a period of at least three years
8 during War II, and was a resident of this state when inducted, shall be
9 deemed to be a member of the bar of this state without examination,

- 10 provided such person graduated from an accredited law school after
11 January 1, 1938 and not later than December 31, 1938."
