**"An Act Concerning Changes To Statutes Affecting The  
Department Of Public Safety."**

1 After the enacting clause, and before "(NEW)" insert "Section 1."

2 Strike subdivision (2) of subsection (a) of section 1 in its entirety and  
3 insert the following in lieu thereof:

4 "(2) The purpose of the office shall be to work for better  
5 understanding and improved relationships between Indians and non-  
6 Indians by (A) providing research and advice regarding laws and  
7 regulations concerning state-recognized and federally-recognized  
8 Indian tribes, (B) fostering awareness of the legal, social and economic  
9 relationship between state-recognized and federally-recognized tribes  
10 and the state, (C) facilitating communication and exchange of  
11 information between state-recognized and federally-recognized Indian  
12 tribes and the state, and (D) reviewing and reporting on all proposed  
13 legislation affecting state-recognized and federally-recognized Indian  
14 tribes, and carrying out the directions of the advisory committee with

15 respect to such legislation, and (E) studying the effects of gaming,  
16 including, but not limited to, betting at casinos operated by Indian  
17 tribes and betting on bingo, duck-race raffles and other games of  
18 chance."

19 After section 1, insert the following:

20 "Sec. 2. Subsection (g) of section 7-185a of the general statutes is  
21 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof:

22 (g) (1) [Any] Notwithstanding the provisions of section 7-177, any  
23 sponsoring organization qualified to conduct a bazaar or raffle under  
24 the provisions of section 7-172 may operate a duck-race raffle once  
25 each calendar year and, pursuant to a "class no. 1", "class no. 2" or  
26 "class no. 4" permit, may award cash prizes in connection with  
27 participation in such a raffle, in addition to those prizes authorized  
28 pursuant to section 7-177. Such raffles shall conform to the provisions  
29 of sections 7-170 to 7-186, inclusive, and shall be subject to regulation  
30 by the executive director. For the purpose of this subsection,  
31 "duck-race raffle" means a raffle in which artificial ducks, numbered  
32 consecutively to correspond with the number of tickets sold for such  
33 raffle, are placed in a naturally moving stream of water at a designated  
34 starting point and in which the ticket corresponding to the number of  
35 the first duck to pass a designated finishing point is the winning ticket.  
36 (2) The executive director of the Division of Special Revenue, with the  
37 advice and consent of the Gaming Policy Board, shall adopt  
38 regulations, in accordance with chapter 54, that establish procedures  
39 for the operation of duck-race raffles."
