An Act Concerning Judicial Salaries.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Subsection (a) of section 51-47 of the general statutes, as
2 amended by section 37 of public act 99-1 of the June special session, is
3 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof:

4 (a) The judges of the Superior Court, judges of the Appellate Court
5 and judges of the Supreme Court shall receive annually salaries as
6 follows:

7 (1) On and after October 1, 1997, (A) the Chief Justice of the
8 Supreme Court, one hundred twenty-six thousand forty-eight dollars;
9 (B) the Chief Court Administrator if a judge of the Supreme Court,
10 Appellate Court or Superior Court, one hundred twenty thousand four
11 hundred thirty dollars; (C) each associate judge of the Supreme Court,
12 one hundred fifteen thousand three hundred three dollars; (D) the
13 Chief Judge of the Appellate Court, one hundred thirteen thousand
14 eight hundred thirty-two dollars; (E) each judge of the Appellate
15 Court, one hundred seven thousand two hundred fourteen dollars; (F)

16 the Deputy Chief Court Administrator if a judge of the Superior Court,
17 one hundred four thousand nine hundred thirty-five dollars; and (G)
18 each judge of the Superior Court, one hundred two thousand four
19 hundred twenty dollars.

20 (2) On and after October 1, 1998, (A) the Chief Justice of the
21 Supreme Court, one hundred twenty-eight thousand five hundred
22 sixty-nine dollars; (B) the Chief Court Administrator if a judge of the
23 Supreme Court, Appellate Court or Superior Court, one hundred
24 twenty-two thousand eight hundred thirty-nine dollars; (C) each
25 associate judge of the Supreme Court, one hundred seventeen
26 thousand six hundred ten dollars; (D) the Chief Judge of the Appellate
27 Court, one hundred sixteen thousand one hundred nine dollars; (E)
28 each judge of the Appellate Court, one hundred nine thousand three
29 hundred fifty-nine dollars; (F) the Deputy Chief Court Administrator if
30 a judge of the Superior Court, one hundred seven thousand thirty-four
31 dollars; and (G) each judge of the Superior Court, one hundred four
32 thousand four hundred sixty-nine dollars.

33 (3) On and after October 1, 1999, (A) the Chief Justice of the
34 Supreme Court, one hundred thirty-one thousand one hundred forty
35 dollars; (B) the Chief Court Administrator if a judge of the Supreme
36 Court, Appellate Court or Superior Court, one hundred twenty-five
37 thousand two hundred ninety-six dollars; (C) each associate judge of
38 the Supreme Court, one hundred nineteen thousand nine hundred
39 sixty-two dollars; (D) the Chief Judge of the Appellate Court, one
40 hundred eighteen thousand four hundred thirty-one dollars; (E) each
41 judge of the Appellate Court, one hundred eleven thousand five
42 hundred forty-six dollars; (F) the Deputy Chief Court Administrator if
43 a judge of the Superior Court, one hundred nine thousand one
44 hundred seventy-five dollars; and (G) each judge of the Superior
45 Court, one hundred six thousand five hundred fifty-eight dollars.

46 (4) On and after April 1, 2000, (A) the Chief Justice of the Supreme
47 Court, one hundred thirty-five thousand eight hundred sixty-one

48 dollars; (B) the Chief Court Administrator if a judge of the Supreme
49 Court, Appellate Court or Superior Court, one hundred thirty
50 thousand seventeen dollars; (C) each associate judge of the Supreme
51 Court, one hundred twenty-four thousand six hundred eighty-three
52 dollars; (D) the Chief Judge of the Appellate Court, one hundred
53 twenty-three thousand one hundred fifty-two dollars; (E) each judge of
54 the Appellate Court, one hundred sixteen thousand two hundred
55 sixty-seven dollars; (F) the Deputy Chief Court Administrator if a
56 judge of the Superior Court, one hundred thirteen thousand eight
57 hundred ninety-six dollars; (G) each judge of the Superior Court, one
58 hundred eleven thousand two hundred seventy-nine dollars.

59 (5) On and after April 1, 2001, (A) the Chief Justice of the Supreme
60 Court, one hundred forty thousand five hundred eighty-two dollars;
61 (B) the Chief Court Administrator if a judge of the Supreme Court,
62 Appellate Court or Superior Court, one hundred thirty-four thousand
63 seven hundred thirty-eight dollars; (C) each associate judge of the
64 Supreme Court, one hundred twenty-nine thousand four hundred four
65 dollars; (D) the Chief Judge of the Appellate Court, one hundred
66 twenty-seven thousand eight hundred seventy-three dollars; (E) each
67 judge of the Appellate Court, one hundred twenty thousand nine
68 hundred eighty-eight dollars; (F) the Deputy Chief Court
69 Administrator if a judge of the Superior Court, one hundred eighteen
70 thousand six hundred seventeen dollars; (G) each judge of the Superior
71 Court, one hundred sixteen thousand dollars.

72 (6) On and after April 1, 2002, (A) the Chief Justice of the Supreme
73 Court, one hundred forty-nine thousand five hundred eighty-two
74 dollars; (B) the Chief Court Administrator if a judge of the Supreme
75 Court, Appellate Court or Superior Court, one hundred forty-three
76 thousand seven hundred thirty-eight dollars; (C) each associate judge
77 of the Supreme Court, one hundred thirty-eight thousand four
78 hundred four dollars; (D) the Chief Judge of the Appellate Court, one
79 hundred thirty-six thousand eight hundred seventy-three dollars; (E)
80 each judge of the Appellate Court, one hundred twenty-nine thousand

81 nine hundred eighty-eight dollars; (F) the Deputy Chief Court
82 Administrator if a judge of the Superior Court, one hundred twenty-
83 seven thousand six hundred seventeen dollars; (G) each judge of the
84 Superior Court, one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars.

85 Sec. 2. Subsection (h) of section 46b-231 of the general statutes, as
86 amended by section 38 of public act 99-1 of the June special session, is
87 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof:

88 (h) (1) On and after October 1, 1997, the Chief Family Support
89 Magistrate shall receive a salary of seventy-eight thousand seven
90 hundred sixty-nine dollars, and other family support magistrates shall
91 receive an annual salary of seventy-three thousand eight hundred
92 seventy-eight dollars.

93 (2) On and after October 1, 1998, the Chief Family Support
94 Magistrate shall receive a salary of eighty thousand three hundred
95 forty-five dollars, and other family support magistrates shall receive an
96 annual salary of seventy-five thousand three hundred fifty-six dollars.

97 (3) On and after October 1, 1999, the Chief Family Support
98 Magistrate shall receive a salary of eighty-one thousand nine hundred
99 fifty-two dollars, and other family support magistrates shall receive an
100 annual salary of seventy-six thousand eight hundred sixty-three
101 dollars.

102 (4) On and after April 1, 2000, the Chief Family Support Magistrate
103 shall receive a salary of ninety-nine thousand five hundred eighty-
104 seven dollars, and other family support magistrates shall receive an
105 annual salary of ninety-four thousand five hundred eighty-seven
106 dollars.

107 (5) On and after April 1, 2001, the Chief Family Support Magistrate
108 shall receive a salary of one hundred three thousand six hundred
109 dollars, and other family support magistrates shall receive an annual
110 salary of ninety-eight thousand six hundred dollars.

111 (6) On and after April 1, 2002, the Chief Family Support Magistrate
112 shall receive a salary of one hundred eight thousand eight hundred
113 twenty-one dollars, and other family support magistrates shall receive
114 an annual salary of one hundred three thousand five hundred sixty-
115 nine dollars.

116 Sec. 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2000.
