***Resolution Concerning The Rules Of The Senate For The May,  
2000 Special Session.***

Resolved by the Senate:

- 1 That the rules of the Senate at this Special Session shall be the same
- 2 as the rules of the Senate in force at the 2000 regular session, except as
- 3 said rules are amended, altered or repealed in this resolution.
  
- 4 Strike out Rules 7, 9, 13, 17 and 18.
  
- 5 Strike out Rule 19 and insert in lieu thereof the following:
  
- 6 19. The order of business shall be as follows:
  
- 7 1. Reception of communications from the governor.
- 8 2. Introduction of bills and resolutions.
- 9 3. Reception of business from the house.
- 10 4. Introduction of guests.

11       Strike out Rule 29 and insert in lieu thereof the following:

12       29. When a question is under debate, no motion shall be received  
13       except:

14       1. To adjourn.

15       2. To recess.

16       3. For the previous question.

17       4. To close the debate at a specified time.

18       5. To pass temporarily.

19       6. To pass retain.

20       7. To postpone to a certain time.

21       8. To divide the question.

22       9. To amend.

23       10. To postpone indefinitely.

24       These several motions shall have precedence in the order listed in  
25       this rule, and no motion to continue to the next general assembly or to  
26       postpone indefinitely, having been once decided, shall be again  
27       allowed at the same session and at the same state of the bill or subject  
28       matter.

29       Strike out Rule 30 and insert in lieu thereof the following:

30       30. Amendments shall be filed with the clerk of the Senate.

31       Any member who offers an amendment, originating in the Senate  
32       which, if adopted, would reduce state revenues or increase state  
33       expenditures by a specified amount or which would involve a  
34       significant fiscal impact, shall make available to the president,

35 president pro tempore, the majority leader of the Senate and the  
36 minority leader of the Senate at the time the amendment is offered, in  
37 addition to a fiscal note, a signed and typewritten explanation, of the  
38 decrease in expenditures or the source of the increased revenues  
39 required to balance the state budget.

40 Whenever a bill is substantively amended, it may be referred to the  
41 legislative commissioners to be re-examined for the purposes set forth  
42 in Rule 13 and to be reprinted as amended. The legislative  
43 commissioners' office shall complete its examination of any such bill  
44 within three calendar days of its receipt. The bill shall then be  
45 transmitted to the clerk.

46 Add a new Rule 37 as follows:

47 37. Only those bills specified in paragraph 1 of Rule 7 of the Joint  
48 Rules for this session certified as provided in Rule 9 of said Rules, and,  
49 except as provided in Joint Rule 33, only those substantive resolutions  
50 pertaining to the rules of this Special Session and the printing of the  
51 journals of the senate and the house of representatives and the  
52 expenses of this Special Session, shall be received.
