AN ACT CONCERNING THE EXPENDITURES OF THE OFFICE OF POLICY AND MANAGEMENT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 (NEW) The Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management shall
- 2 review the functions and activities of the Office of Policy and
- 3 Management in order to evaluate the cost-effectiveness and benefits of
- 4 such functions and activities and assign priority for their continued
- 5 funding. The secretary shall submit findings and recommendations to
- 6 the joint standing committee of the General Assembly having
- 7 cognizance of matters relating to appropriations and the budgets of
- 8 state agencies not later than February 20, 2002, and annually thereafter.

**AN ACT CONCERNING THE EXPENDITURES OF THE OFFICE OF
POLICY AND MANAGEMENT.**

SUMMARY:

The bill requires the Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management to review the agency's programs for cost effectiveness and benefits and prioritization for funding. The findings and recommendations must be reported to the Appropriations Committee of the General Assembly not later than February 20, 2002 and annually thereafter.
