The Committee on Commerce reported through SEN. LEBEAU of the 3rd Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the bill ought to pass.

AN ACT ESTABLISHING A TECHNOLOGY TRAINING PROGRAM FOR INCUMBENT WORKERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. The Commissioner of Economic and Community
- 2 Development shall establish a program providing technology training
- 3 to qualifying incumbent workers.

- 4 Sec. 2. This act shall take effect from its passage.

Explanation**State Impact:**

Requiring the Department of Economic and Community Development (DECD) to establish a program to provide technology training to qualifying incumbent workers, upon passage, will increase costs to DECD not currently budgeted for. Since there are no guidelines or program parameters or definitions in the legislation, the cost is indeterminate.
