The Committee on Appropriations reported through SEN. CRISCO of the 17th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING EXPENDITURES FOR THE PROGRAMS AND SERVICES OF THE COMMISSION ON FIRE PREVENTION AND CONTROL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 (NEW) The Commission on Fire Prevention and Control shall
2 review the programs and services administered or provided by the
3 commission in order to (1) evaluate the cost-effectiveness and benefits
4 of such programs and services, and (2) assign priority for the
5 continued funding of such programs and services. The commission
6 shall submit findings and recommendations to the joint standing
7 committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters
8 relating to appropriations and the budgets of state agencies not later
9 than February 20, 2002, and annually thereafter.

The bill requires the Commission on Fire Prevention and Control to review its functions and activities, assign priority for the funding of its programs, and report their findings to the Appropriations Committee by February 20, 2002, and annually thereafter. This will not result in any additional cost to this agency because it already reports on its budget and programs to the Appropriations Committee on an annual basis.

SB 1443

AN ACT CONCERNING EXPENDITURES FOR THE PROGRAMS AND SERVICES OF THE COMMISSION ON FIRE PREVENTION AND CONTROL.

SUMMARY:

The bill requires the Commission on Fire Prevention and Control to review the programs and services administered or provided by the commission in order to (1) evaluate the cost-effectiveness and benefits of such programs and services, and (2) assign priority for the continued funding of such programs and services. The commission is required to submit findings and recommendations to the Appropriations Committee not later than February 20, 2002, and annually thereafter.
