The Committee on Appropriations reported through SEN. CRISCO of the 17th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the bill ought to pass.

### **AN ACT CONCERNING THE EXPENDITURES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF MOTOR VEHICLES.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1       (NEW) The Commissioner of Motor Vehicles shall review the  
2 functions and activities of the Department of Motor Vehicles in order  
3 to evaluate the costs and benefits of such functions and activities and  
4 assign priority for their continued funding. The commissioner shall  
5 submit findings and recommendations to the joint standing committee  
6 of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to  
7 appropriations and the budgets of state agencies not later than  
8 February 20, 2002, and annually thereafter.
