The Committee on Appropriations reported through SEN. CRISCO of the 17th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING EXPENDITURES OF THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 (NEW) The Attorney General shall review expenditures for various
- 2 functions and activities of the office of the Attorney General in order to
- 3 evaluate the cost and effectiveness of such functions and activities and
- 4 assign priority for their continued funding. The Attorney General shall
- 5 submit findings and recommendations to the joint standing committee
- 6 of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to
- 7 appropriations and the budgets of state agencies not later than
- 8 February 20, 2002, and annually thereafter.

AN ACT CONCERNING EXPENDITURES OF THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL.

SUMMARY:

The bill requires the Attorney General to review the agency's programs for cost effectiveness and benefits and prioritization for funding. The findings and recommendations must be reported to the Appropriations Committee of the General Assembly not later than February 20, 2002 and annually thereafter.
