AN ACT CONCERNING THE EXPENDITURES OF THE DIVISION OF SPECIAL REVENUE AND THE GAMING POLICY BOARD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 (NEW) The executive director of the Division of Special Revenue
2 and the chairperson of the Gaming Policy Board shall review the
3 functions and activities of the Division of Special Revenue and the
4 Gaming Policy Board in order to assign priority for the continued
5 funding of such functions and activities and shall submit findings,
6 including any recommendations for legislation to modify such
7 functions and activities, to the joint standing committee of the General
8 Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to appropriations and
9 the budgets of state agencies not later than February 20, 2002, and
10 annually thereafter.

AN ACT CONCERNING THE EXPENDITURES OF THE DIVISION OF SPECIAL REVENUE AND THE GAMING POLICY BOARD.

SUMMARY:

The bill requires the Division of Special Revenue and the Gaming Policy Board to review the functions and activities of these agencies and to assign priority for the continued funding of the activities and functions. The agencies are required to submit a report on the findings, including any recommendations for legislation to modify the activities and functions, to the Appropriations Committee by February 20, 2002, and annually thereafter.
