**AN ACT CONCERNING INCENTIVES FOR MUNICIPAL  
AGGREGATION AND CONSOLIDATION OF ELECTRIC GENERATION.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. The Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management  
2 shall develop a proposed program of incentives for municipalities to  
3 become electric aggregators, as defined in section 16-1 of the general  
4 statutes. On or before February 1, 2002, the secretary shall submit a  
5 report on such proposed program to the joint standing committees of  
6 the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to  
7 municipalities and to energy. The report shall include detailed  
8 financial estimates for each incentive considered by the secretary and  
9 recommendations for legislation, if any.

10 Sec. 2. (NEW) Notwithstanding the provisions of the general  
11 statutes, any electric company, as defined in section 16-1 of the general  
12 statutes, that acquires more than fifty per cent of the electric generating  
13 capacity for the state shall be regulated by the Department of Public  
14 Utility Control.

15 Sec. 3. This act shall take effect from its passage, except that section

16 2 shall take effect October 1, 2001.

**Statement of Purpose:**

To require the Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management to develop a program of incentives for municipal aggregators and to give the Department of Public Utility Control jurisdiction over electric companies acquiring fifty per cent or more of the electric generating capacity for the state.
