"AN ACT CONCERNING A COASTAL RESOURCES ADVISORY COUNCIL."

1 Strike out everything after the enacting clause and substitute the
2 following in lieu thereof:

3 "(NEW) (a) There is established the Connecticut Coastal Resources
4 Advisory Council that shall be within the Connecticut Maritime
5 Coalition, for administrative purposes only.

6 (b) The council shall consist of the following members: (1) One
7 representative of the marine trades organization appointed by the
8 speaker of the House of Representatives; (2) one representative of the
9 commercial fishing industry appointed by the majority leader of the
10 Senate; (3) one representative of the recreational fishing community
11 appointed by the president pro tempore of the Senate; (4) one
12 representative of the Connecticut Harbor Management Organization
13 appointed by the majority leader of the House of Representatives; (5)
14 one representative of an environmental organization appointed by the
15 Governor; (6) one representative of a municipality with a population of

16 less than twenty thousand residents appointed by the minority leader
17 of the Senate; (7) one representative of a municipality with a
18 population of more than fifty thousand residents appointed by the
19 minority leader of the House of Representatives; (8) one representative
20 of the Connecticut Maritime Coalition appointed by the Governor; (9)
21 one representative of the Connecticut Seafood Council appointed by
22 the Governor. The Commissioners of Agriculture, Economic
23 Development, Environmental Protection and Transportation shall be
24 ex-officio members of the council.

25 (c) The council shall: (1) Review policy on dredging and disposal of
26 dredging spoils; (2) advise and make recommendations to the
27 Department of Environmental Protection on dredging and disposal of
28 dredging spoils; and (3) in accordance with section 11-4a of the general
29 statutes, annually prepare and submit to the Governor and the General
30 Assembly a report making recommendations on dredging and
31 disposal of dredging spoils.

32 (d) The council may use such funds as may be available from
33 federal, state or other sources and may enter into contracts to carry out
34 the purposes of this section."
