**"AN ACT CONCERNING RESTRAINING AND PROTECTIVE
ORDERS IN FIREARMS CASES."**

1 After the last section, add the following:

2 "Sec. 6. Section 29-37f of the general statutes is repealed and the
3 following is substituted in lieu thereof:

4 No person, firm or corporation that engages in the retail sale of
5 goods, where the principal part of such trade or business is the retail
6 sale of goods other than firearms, shall [employ a person to] sell
7 firearms in a retail store. [unless such person (1) is at least eighteen
8 years of age, (2) has submitted to state and national criminal history
9 records checks and such checks indicate that such person has not been
10 convicted of a felony or a violation specified in subdivision (2) of
11 subsection (b) of section 29-36f, and (3) has successfully completed a
12 course or testing approved by the Commissioner of Public Safety in
13 firearms safety and statutory procedures relating to the sale of

14 firearms. The sale of firearms by such person, firm or corporation shall
15 be accomplished only by an employee qualified pursuant to this
16 section. Any employer who employs a person to sell] Any person,
17 firm or corporation that sells firearms in violation of the provisions of
18 this section shall be liable for a civil penalty of not more than ten
19 thousand dollars per day for each violation. The Attorney General
20 shall institute a civil action to recover such penalty."
