**"AN ACT CONCERNING A COASTAL RESOURCES ADVISORY COUNCIL."**

1 Strike out everything after the enacting clause and substitute the  
2 following in lieu thereof:

3 "(NEW) (a) There is established the Connecticut Coastal Resources  
4 Advisory Council that shall be within the Connecticut Maritime  
5 Coalition, for administrative purposes only.

6 (b) The council shall consist of the following members: (1) One  
7 representative of the marine trades organization appointed by the  
8 speaker of the House of Representatives; (2) one representative of the  
9 commercial fishing industry appointed by the majority leader of the  
10 House of Representatives; (3) one representative of the recreational  
11 fishing community appointed by the president pro tempore of the  
12 Senate; (4) one representative of the Connecticut Harbor Management  
13 Organization appointed by the majority leader of the House of  
14 Representatives; (5) one representative of an environmental  
15 organization appointed by the Governor; (6) one representative of a

16 municipality with a population of less than twenty thousand residents  
17 appointed by the minority leader of the Senate; (7) one representative  
18 of a municipality with a population of more than fifty thousand  
19 residents appointed by the minority leader of the House of  
20 Representatives; (8) one representative of the Connecticut Maritime  
21 Coalition appointed by the Governor; (9) one representative of the  
22 Connecticut Seafood Council appointed by the Governor. The  
23 Commissioners of Agriculture, Economic Development,  
24 Environmental Protection and Transportation shall be ex-officio  
25 members of the council.

26 (c) The council shall: (1) Review policy on dredging and disposal of  
27 dredging spoils; (2) advise and make recommendations to the  
28 Department of Environmental Protection on dredging and disposal of  
29 dredging spoils; and (3) in accordance with section 11-4a of the general  
30 statutes, annually prepare and submit to the Governor and the General  
31 Assembly a report making recommendations on dredging and  
32 disposal of dredging spoils.

33 (d) The council may use such funds as may be available from  
34 federal, state or other sources and may enter into contracts to carry out  
35 the purposes of this section."
