The Committee on Judiciary reported through REP. LAWLOR of the 99th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the House, that the joint resolution ought to be adopted.

Resolved by this Assembly:

1 That the recommendation of the Claims Commissioner, file
2 numbers 15583, 15584, 15585, 15586, 15587 and 15938 of said
3 commissioner, that no award be granted to Kenneth J. Henton, Keith
4 Bland, Maurice T. Washington, John Bratz, Joseph Hall and the Estate
5 of Richard Andrew Mann on their claims against the state in excess of
6 seven thousand five hundred dollars and that permission to sue be
7 denied, is accepted.

Explanation

The resolution denies a grant award in excess of \$7,500 and permission to sue for Kenneth Henton et al to recover damages for personal injuries allegedly suffered as a result of negligence by the Department of Correction. The resolution thereby results in a potential significant cost avoidance for the state to pay for any potential judgment rendered against it, and a potential minimal cost avoidance for litigation.¹

¹ The Attorney General (AG) may assign a third party to represent state entities on his behalf. If permission to sue had been granted, the AG could have required the Department of Correction to hire outside legal counsel at a cost of \$25,000 - \$50,000.
