Substitute Senate Bill No. 311

Senate, April 16, 2002

The Committee on Appropriations reported through SEN. CRISCO of the 17th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the substitute bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING RURAL DEVELOPMENT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. (*Effective July 1, 2002*) The Department of Economic and
2 Community Development shall provide, within existing budgetary
3 resources, a grant of seventy-five thousand dollars, for the fiscal year
4 ending June 30, 2003, to the Connecticut Rural Development Council,
5 for the provision by said council of technical assistance and training in
6 economic development and land use principles to rural municipalities.

This act shall take effect as follows:

Explanation

This bill requires the Department of Economic and Community Development to provide a \$75,000 grant in FY 03 to the Connecticut Rural Development Council from existing budgetary resources. The Council is to provide technical assistance and training in economic development and land use principals to rural municipalities. No specific funding is provided for this grant in sHB 5019 (the budget bill, as favorably reported by the Appropriations Committee). It is unclear at this time, what account these funds would come from and/or what activity or program could be reduced. This action could result in a deficiency.
