The Committee on Government Administration and Elections reported through SEN. FONFARA of the 1st Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING THE SECRETARY OF THE STATE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) The Secretary of the State shall
2 conduct a study of the operations of the Office of the Secretary of the
3 State and submit a report on the secretary's findings and
4 recommendations not later than January 1, 2003, to the joint standing
5 committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters
6 relating to elections.

This act shall take effect as follows:
