The Committee on Appropriations reported through SEN. CRISCO of the 17th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the bill ought to pass.

**AN ACT CONCERNING EXPENDITURES FOR THE PROGRAMS AND SERVICES OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CONNECTICUT HEALTH CENTER.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective July 1, 2002*) The Board of Trustees of The  
2 University of Connecticut shall review the programs and services  
3 administered or provided by the health center in order to assess the  
4 effectiveness and benefits of such programs and services and assign  
5 priority for their continued funding. The board shall report its findings  
6 and recommendations to the joint standing committee of the General  
7 Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to appropriations and  
8 the budgets of state agencies not later than January 15, 2003, and  
9 annually thereafter.

This act shall take effect as follows:
