Senate Bill No. 652

*Senate, April 15, 2002*

The Committee on Appropriations reported through SEN. CRISCO of the 17th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the bill ought to pass.

***AN ACT CONCERNING THE EXPENDITURES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS' AFFAIRS.***

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective July 1, 2002*) The Commissioner of  
2 Veterans' Affairs shall review the operation, administration and  
3 management of the programs and services under the jurisdiction of the  
4 department in order to assess the effectiveness and benefits of such  
5 programs and services and assign priority for their continued funding.  
6 The commissioner shall submit findings and recommendations to the  
7 joint standing committee of the General Assembly having cognizance  
8 of matters relating to appropriations and the budgets of state agencies  
9 not later than January 15, 2003, and annually thereafter.

This act shall take effect as follows:

**AN ACT CONCERNING THE EXPENDITURES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS' AFFAIRS.****SUMMARY:**

This bill requires the commissioner of Veterans' Affairs to review the programs and services of the department in order to assess the effectiveness and benefits of such programs and services and assign priority for their continued funding. The commissioner shall submit findings and recommendations not later than January 15, 2003, and annually thereafter, to the joint standing committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to appropriations and the budget of state agencies.
