**AN ACT CONCERNING USES OF THE ENHANCED 9-1-1  
TELECOMMUNICATIONS FUND.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Section 28-30a of the general statutes is repealed and the  
2 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1, 2002*):

3 (a) There is established a fund to be known as the "Enhanced 9-1-1  
4 Telecommunications Fund". The fund shall contain any moneys  
5 required by law to be deposited in the fund, including, but not limited  
6 to, any federal funds collected pursuant to subsection (d) of section 28-  
7 24 and fees assessed against subscribers of local telephone service and  
8 subscribers of commercial mobile radio services, pursuant to section  
9 16-256g. The Enhanced 9-1-1 Telecommunications Fund shall be held  
10 separate and apart from all other moneys, funds and accounts. Interest  
11 derived from the investment of the fund shall be credited to the assets  
12 of the fund. Any balance remaining in the fund at the end of any fiscal  
13 year shall be carried forward in the fund for the fiscal year next  
14 succeeding.

15 (b) The State Treasurer, in consultation with the Secretary of the

16 Office of Policy and Management, shall invest the moneys deposited in  
17 the Enhanced 9-1-1 Telecommunications Fund in the Short-Term  
18 Investment Fund authorized under section 3-27a or investments in  
19 which the Treasurer may invest assets of the trust funds which are  
20 listed in section 3-13c.

21 (c) The resources of the Enhanced 9-1-1 Telecommunications Fund  
22 shall be used [solely] (1) to fund the expenses, as determined by the  
23 Commissioner of Public Safety in accordance with subsection (c) of  
24 section 28-24, associated with the enhanced emergency 9-1-1 program,  
25 and (2) for reimbursement to municipalities for activities consistent  
26 with local emergency services plans prepared pursuant to section 19a-  
27 181b. Any surplus shall be carried forward to successive fiscal years  
28 and used for the [sole] purpose of administering the enhanced  
29 emergency 9-1-1 program and for reimbursements under subdivision  
30 (2) of this subsection.

This act shall take effect as follows:	
Section 1	July 1, 2002

**Statement of Purpose:**  
To provide funding for local emergency medical services activities from the Enhanced 9-1-1 Telecommunications Fund.
