1 In line 111, strike "six" and insert "twenty" in lieu thereof

2 After the last section, insert the following:

3 "Sec. 7. Subsection (d) of section 20-74s of the general statutes is
4 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective*
5 *October 1, 2002*):

6 (d) To be eligible for licensure as a licensed alcohol and drug
7 counselor, an applicant shall (1) [have attained a master's degree from
8 an accredited institution of higher education with a minimum of
9 eighteen graduate semester hours in counseling or counseling-related
10 subjects] have attained a minimum of eighteen graduate semester
11 hours, from an accredited institution of higher education, in
12 counseling or counseling-related subjects as part of a master's degree
13 or subsequent to completing a master's degree, except that applicants
14 holding certified clinical supervisor status by the Connecticut

15 Certification Board, Inc. as of October 1, 1998, may substitute such
16 certification in lieu of the master's degree requirement, and (2) be
17 certified or have met all the requirements for certification as a certified
18 alcohol and drug counselor."
