"AN ACT CONCERNING BULLYING BEHAVIOR IN SCHOOLS."

1 After the last section, insert the following:

2 "Sec. 2. (NEW) (*Effective July 1, 2002*) The Department of Public
3 Health, in consultation with the Department of Education, shall
4 establish within available appropriations a Neurofeedback pilot
5 program for the 2002-2003 school year for forty school students twelve
6 to fourteen years of age, inclusive. The pilot program shall operate for
7 a period of one year in a school district of a town in the ninety-fifth

8 percentile when all towns are ranked from high to low based on the
9 amount of special education funding each town receives from the state.
10 Local and regional boards of education interested in participating in
11 the pilot program shall apply to the department at such time and in
12 such a manner as the Commissioner of Public Health prescribes. The
13 commissioner shall report, in accordance with section 11-4a of the
14 general statutes, on the pilot program to the joint standing committees
15 of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to
16 public health and education."
