**"AN ACT REQUIRING DISCLOSURE OF MUNICIPAL CONTRACTS
HELD BY CERTAIN CONTRIBUTORS TO CANDIDATES FOR THE
OFFICE OF CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF A MUNICIPALITY."**

1 After line 91, insert the following:

2 "Sec. 2. (NEW) (*Effective from passage*) (a) If the spouse or a child of a
3 town clerk of a municipality is a candidate in a primary or an election
4 in the municipality, the town clerk shall be deemed to have a conflict
5 of interest. Upon receipt of a complaint from any person of such a
6 conflict of interest, the State Elections Enforcement Commission shall

7 investigate and, if the commission verifies the conflict of interest, the
8 commission shall issue an order prohibiting the town clerk from taking
9 any official action with regard to (1) absentee voting at such primary or
10 election, or (2) voting on the day of such primary or election.

11 (b) The State Elections Enforcement Commission shall adopt
12 regulations, in accordance with the provisions of chapter 54 of the
13 general statutes, (1) defining "official action" for the purposes of this
14 section, and (2) establishing provisions for the assumption by another
15 official or officials of such absentee voting and voting duties of a town
16 clerk found to have such a conflict of interest."
