**"AN ACT CONCERNING THE CONFIDENTIALITY OF MILITARY
DISCHARGE DOCUMENTS."**

1 After the last section, insert the following:

2 "Sec. 2. Section 21-37 of the general statutes is repealed and the
3 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October 1, 2002*):

4 Any town may make reasonable ordinances with reference to the
5 vending or hawking upon its public streets or upon any state highway,
6 except limited access highways, within such town or any land abutting
7 such streets or highways of any goods, wares or other merchandise at
8 public or private sale or auction, or to the vending or peddling of such
9 articles from house to house within its limits, including the imposition
10 of a fee, not exceeding two hundred dollars a year, applicable with
11 respect to any person engaged in such vending, hawking or peddling,
12 for the privilege of so vending, hawking or peddling such
13 merchandise. Any ordinance adopted pursuant to this section which
14 requires a permit may require that no such permit shall be issued to

15 any person who has not obtained a permit to engage in or transact
16 business as a seller within the state in accordance with section 12-409
17 and shall require that any permit issued pursuant to such ordinance
18 shall be conspicuously displayed at the place the activities are
19 undertaken. Such ordinances may provide that the authority issuing
20 such permit may waive the permit fee for a nonprofit organization
21 exempt from federal taxation by Section 501 of the Internal Revenue
22 Code of 1986, or any subsequent corresponding internal revenue code
23 of the United States, as from time to time amended, or a charitable
24 organization. No town shall require a permit fee from any resident of
25 this state who has resided within the state for a period of two years
26 next preceding the date of application for such permit, who is a
27 veteran who served in time of war, as defined in section 27-103, and
28 who is a principal pursuant to section 21-36. This section shall not
29 apply to sales by farmers and gardeners of the produce of their farms,
30 gardens and greenhouses, including fruit, vegetables and flowers, or to
31 the sale, distribution and delivery of milk, teas, coffees, spices,
32 groceries, meats and bakery goods, to sales on approval, to conditional
33 sales of merchandise, or to the taking of orders for merchandise for
34 future delivery when full payment is not required at the time of
35 solicitation. Nothing in this section shall be construed to limit in any
36 manner the Commissioner of Transportation's statutory authority
37 concerning state highways. Nothing in this section shall be construed
38 as empowering any municipality to prohibit, regulate, control or
39 impose a fee on any person operating any business on any state
40 highway or land abutting any state highway pursuant to a contract
41 with the state."
