"AN ACT CONCERNING STATE EXPENDITURES."

1 After section 115, insert the following and renumber the remaining
2 section accordingly:

3 "Sec. 116. Section 52 of public act 02-1 of the May 9 special session is
4 amended to read as follows (*Effective from passage*):

5 (a) In addition to the provisions of section 4-85 of the general
6 statutes and with respect to the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, any
7 allotment requisition and any allotment in force shall be subject to the
8 following: If the Governor determines that a fiscal exigency related to
9 the budget adopted for said fiscal year requires that certain reductions
10 should be made in allotment requisitions or allotments in force or that
11 estimated budget resources during the fiscal year will be insufficient to
12 finance all appropriations in full and that the reductions made
13 pursuant to section 4-85 of the general statutes will not be sufficient to
14 address the exigency or insufficiency, the Governor may, on or after
15 October 1, 2002, modify such allotment requisitions or allotments in
16 force to the extent the Governor deems necessary above the amounts
17 allowed under said section 4-85, subject to the provisions of this
18 section. Before such modifications are effected the Governor shall file a
19 report with the joint standing committee having cognizance of matters
20 relating to appropriations and the budgets of state agencies and the
21 joint standing committee having cognizance of matters relating to state
22 finance, revenue and bonding describing the exigency which makes it
23 necessary that certain reductions should be made or the basis for his
24 determination that estimated budget resources will be insufficient to
25 finance all appropriations in full. No modification of an allotment
26 requisition or an allotment in force made by the Governor pursuant to
27 this subsection shall result in a reduction of (1) more than five per cent
28 of the total appropriation from any fund in excess of the amount
29 allowed under said section 4-85 or more than five per cent of any
30 appropriation in excess of the amount allowed under said section 4-85,
31 or (2) more than thirty-five million dollars, except such limitations
32 shall not apply in time of war, invasion or emergency caused by
33 natural disaster.

34 (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 4-85 of the general
35 statutes, if a plan submitted in accordance with subsection (b) of said
36 section 4-85 indicates that a reduction of more than three per cent of
37 the total appropriation from any fund or more than five per cent of any
38 appropriation is required to prevent a deficit, the Governor shall not

39 be required to request that the Finance Advisory Committee approve
40 any such reduction made pursuant to this section.

41 (c) The secretary shall submit copies of allotment requisitions thus
42 approved or modified or allotments in force thus modified, with the
43 reasons for any modifications, to the administrative heads of the
44 budgeted agencies concerned, to the Comptroller and to the joint
45 standing committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of
46 appropriations and matters relating to the budgets of state agencies,
47 through the Office of Fiscal Analysis. The Comptroller shall set up
48 such allotments on the Comptroller's books and be governed thereby
49 in the control of expenditures of budgeted agencies.

50 (d) The provisions of this section shall not be construed to authorize
51 the Governor to reduce allotment requisitions or allotments in force
52 concerning [Education Cost Sharing, Town Aid Road. PILOT- Colleges
53 and Hospitals or PILOT - State Owned Property] aid to
54 municipalities."
