House Bill No. 6569

*House of Representatives, April 29, 2003*

The Committee on Judiciary reported through REP. LAWLOR of the 99th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the House, that the bill ought to pass.

## **AN ACT CONCERNING THE COMPOSITION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTION.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Section 18-78 of the general statutes is repealed and the  
2 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October 1, 2003*):

3 There is established a state Department of Correction [L] which shall  
4 consist of [the Enfield Correctional Institution, Enfield; the Northern  
5 Correctional Institution, Somers; the Osborn Correctional Institution,  
6 Somers; the Carl Robinson Correctional Institution, Enfield; the  
7 William Willard-Alexander J. Cybulski Correctional Institution,  
8 Enfield; the Bridgeport Correctional Center, Bridgeport; the Cheshire  
9 Correctional Institution, Cheshire; the Ward A. Garner Correctional  
10 Institution, Newtown; the John R. Manson Youth Institution, Cheshire;  
11 the New Haven Correctional Center, New Haven; the Noah Daniel  
12 Webster Correctional Institution, Cheshire; the Brooklyn Correctional  
13 Institution, Brooklyn; the Raymond L. Corrigan Correctional

14 Institution, Uncasville; the Bernard J. Gates Correctional Institution,  
15 Niantic; the Donald T. Bergin Correctional Institution, Mansfield; the  
16 Stanley J. Radgowski Correctional Institution, Uncasville; the Janet S.  
17 York Correctional Institution, Niantic; the Hartford Correctional  
18 Center, Hartford; the Ellis R. MacDougall Correctional Institution,  
19 Suffield; the Ralph H. Walker Reception and Special Management  
20 Unit, Suffield; and community enforcement offices located in  
21 Bridgeport, Hartford, New Haven, Norwich and Waterbury] all  
22 correctional institutions under its jurisdiction, the regional community  
23 services facilities and the community correctional centers.

This act shall take effect as follows:

**SUMMARY:**

This bill eliminates the list of specific correctional facilities comprising the Department of Correction (DOC). Instead, it specifies that DOC is composed of all correctional institutions under its jurisdiction, the regional community services facilities, and the community correctional centers.
