AN ACT CONCERNING THE DEFINITION OF A "MINOR PARTY".

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 That subdivision (6) of section 9-372 of the general statutes, which
- 2 defines a "minor party" as a party whose candidate for the office in
- 3 question at the last regular election for such office received at least one
- 4 per cent of the votes cast for all candidates for such office, be amended
- 5 by limiting such definition to a party whose candidate for such office
- 6 received less than twenty per cent of such votes.

Statement of Purpose:

To provide that a "minor party" is a party whose candidate for the office in question at the last regular election for such office received at least one per cent but less than twenty per cent of the votes cast for all candidates for such office.
