**"AN ACT CONCERNING SPECIAL ALTERNATIVE
INCARCERATION FOR YOUNG MALE DEFENDANTS."**

1 After the last section, add the following and renumber sections and
2 internal references accordingly:

3 "Sec. 501. Subsection (a) of section 5-173 of the general statutes is
4 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July*
5 *1, 2003*):

6 (a) A state policeman in the active service of the Division of State
7 Police within the Department of Public Safety, or any person who is
8 engaged in guard or instructional duties at the Connecticut
9 Correctional Institution, Somers, the Connecticut Correctional
10 Institution, Enfield-Medium, the Carl Robinson Correctional
11 Institution, Enfield, the John R. Manson Youth Institution, Cheshire,
12 the Connecticut Correctional Institution, Niantic, the Connecticut
13 Correctional Center, Cheshire and the community correctional centers,
14 or any person exempt from collective bargaining who is engaged in

15 custodial or instructional duties within the Department of Correction,
16 or any person who is an employee of the Whiting Forensic Division
17 with direct and substantial patient contact, or any person who is
18 employed as a correctional counselor, correctional counselor
19 supervisor, parole officer or parole supervisor or in a comparable job
20 classification by the Board of Parole, or any member of tier I who has
21 been designated as a hazardous duty member pursuant to an
22 applicable collective bargaining agreement, or any intake assessment
23 supervisor performing duties within the Judicial Department, who has
24 reached his forty-seventh birthday and completed at least twenty years
25 of hazardous duty service for the state or service as a state policeman
26 or as guard or instructor at said correctional institutions or correctional
27 centers, or service in a custodial or instructional position within the
28 Department of Correction which is exempt from collective bargaining,
29 or as an employee of the Whiting Forensic Division or its predecessor
30 institutions, or as a correctional counselor, correctional counselor
31 supervisor, parole officer or parole supervisor or in a comparable job
32 classification as an employee of the Board of Parole, or service as an
33 intake assessment supervisor performing duties within the Judicial
34 Department, shall be retired on his own application or on the
35 application of the Commissioner of Public Safety or the Commissioner
36 of Correction, as the case may be."
