AN ACT ALLOWING SUNDAY SALES OF ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Subsection (d) of section 30-91 of the general statutes, as
2 amended by section 103 of public act 03-1 of the June 30 special session
3 and section 146 of public act 03-6 of the June 30 special session, is
4 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective*
5 *October 1, 2004*):

6 (d) The sale or dispensing of alcoholic liquor in places operating
7 under package store permits, drug store permits or grocery store beer
8 permits shall be unlawful on Decoration Day, Independence Day,
9 Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, New Year's Day [, Sunday] or
10 Christmas or, if Independence Day, Christmas or New Year's Day
11 occurs on a Sunday, on the Monday next following such day except
12 that such sale or dispensing shall be lawful on any Independence Day
13 occurring on a Saturday; and such sale or dispensing of alcoholic
14 liquor in places operating under package store permits, drug store
15 permits, and grocery store beer permits shall be unlawful on any other
16 day before eight o'clock a.m. and after nine o'clock p.m. It shall be
17 unlawful for the holder of a manufacturing permit for a brew pub to

18 sell beer for consumption off the premises on the days or hours
19 prohibited by this subsection. Any town may, by a vote of a town
20 meeting or by ordinance, reduce the number of hours during which
21 such sale shall be permissible.

This act shall take effect as follows:
