**"AN ACT CONCERNING MINOR REVISIONS TO THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION STATUTES."**

1 After the last section, add the following and renumber sections and  
2 internal references accordingly:

3 "Sec. 501. Section 22a-209d of the general statutes is repealed and the  
4 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October 1, 2004*):

5 The Commissioner of Environmental Protection may establish, by  
6 regulations adopted in accordance with the provisions of chapter 54,  
7 categories of materials which, if used in accordance with standards  
8 adopted by the commissioner to protect the environment and public  
9 health, shall not be considered solid waste under section 22a-207, as  
10 amended, or subject to a permit under this chapter or chapter 446k.  
11 [On or before November 1, 1996, the commissioner shall adopt such

12 regulations to facilitate the disposal of solids which are by-products of  
13 water treatment processes which regulations shall provide for the  
14 approval of uses for such solids without further regulation under this  
15 chapter.] Notwithstanding the provisions of the regulations adopted  
16 under this section or section 22a-209, the Commissioner of  
17 Environmental Protection shall not prohibit the use of waste sand from  
18 the casting of metals as cover, road base, fill or other purposes at a  
19 solid waste disposal area permitted under section 22a-208a, provided  
20 the concentration of toxic materials in the sand is below the level of  
21 hazardous waste under the federal Resource Conservation and  
22 Recovery Act of 1976, as amended, and any regulations promulgated  
23 to carry out said act and further provided any person who disposes of  
24 such sand under this section shall provide certification, to the  
25 satisfaction of the Commissioner of Environmental Protection, that  
26 such sand is not hazardous. Notwithstanding the provisions of section  
27 22a-209, a public water supply company may, by itself or in  
28 conjunction with any person or municipality, use solids that are the  
29 by-products of water treatment processes provided such use conforms  
30 to best management practices and controls described in an operations  
31 plan approved in writing by the commissioner. A public water supply  
32 company may, by itself or in conjunction with any person or  
33 municipality, use such solids in accordance with such plan until the  
34 commissioner issues a general permit to such company for the use of  
35 such solids pursuant to section 22a-209f."
