Substitute Senate Bill No. 1053

Senate, April 25, 2005

The Committee on Judiciary reported through SEN. MCDONALD of the 27th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the substitute bill ought to pass.

AN ACT REPEALING THE STATUTE AUTHORIZING A DEMONSTRATION PROJECT TO ESTABLISH A SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY-BASED TRUANCY PREVENTION INITIATIVE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. Section 46b-149d of the general statutes is repealed.
- 2 (*Effective July 1, 2005*)

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

Section 1	<i>July 1, 2005</i>	Repealer section

Explanation

The bill implements the budget by eliminating the statutory authorization for a demonstration project to establish a school and community-based truancy prevention initiative. Substitute for House Bill No. 6671 (the Appropriations Act for the 2005-2007 Biennium, as favorably reported from the Appropriations Committee) eliminates about \$350,000 through the Judicial Department’s Truancy Services line item in each year of the biennium, in accordance with the governor’s recommended budget.
