The Committee on Appropriations reported through SEN. HARP of the 10th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING THE EXPENDITURES OF THE DIVISION OF SPECIAL REVENUE AND THE GAMING POLICY BOARD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective July 1, 2005*) The executive director of the
2 Division of Special Revenue and the chairperson of the Gaming Policy
3 Board shall review the functions and activities of the Division of
4 Special Revenue and the Gaming Policy Board in order to assign
5 priority for the continued funding of such functions and activities and
6 shall submit findings, including any recommendations for legislation
7 to modify such functions and activities, to the joint standing committee
8 of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to
9 appropriations and the budgets of state agencies not later than January
10 1, 2006, and annually thereafter.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

AN ACT CONCERNING THE EXPENDITURES OF THE DIVISION OF SPECIAL REVENUE AND THE GAMING POLICY BOARD.**SUMMARY:**

The bill requires the Division of Special Revenue and the Gaming Policy Board to review their functions and activities in order to evaluate the cost-effectiveness and benefits of such functions and activities and assign priority for their continued funding. They shall submit their findings and recommendations to the joint standing committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to appropriations and the budgets of state agencies not later than January 1, 2006, and annually thereafter.
