**AN ACT CONCERNING RENEWAL OF LAPSED PARAMEDIC LICENSES.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective October 1, 2005*) Any person who was  
2 certified by the Department of Public Health as an emergency medical  
3 technician prior to becoming licensed as a paramedic pursuant to  
4 section 20-206ll of the general statutes, and whose certification as an  
5 emergency medical technician and license as a paramedic become void  
6 pursuant to section 19a-88 of the general statutes, may apply to the  
7 Department of Public Health for recertification as an emergency  
8 medical technician, provided the application (1) is submitted not later  
9 than one year from the date such paramedic license became void, and  
10 (2) is accompanied by evidence satisfactory to the commissioner that  
11 such person completed emergency medical technician refresher  
12 training approved by the commissioner after such license became void.  
13 The department shall recertify such person as an emergency medical  
14 technician without the examination required for initial certification  
15 specified in regulations adopted by the Commissioner of Public Health  
16 pursuant to section 19a-179 of the general statutes.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:		
Section 1	October 1, 2005	New section

**Statement of Purpose:**

To allow a paramedic whose paramedic license has lapsed to be recertified as an emergency medical technician without examination.
