AN ACT CONCERNING THE LIABILITY OF AN OWNER OF A MOTOR VEHICLE FOR VIOLATION OF A TRAFFIC CONTROL SIGNAL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Section 14-107 of the general statutes is repealed and the
2 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October 1, 2005*):

3 (a) The owner, operator or lessee of any motor vehicle may be
4 prosecuted jointly or individually for violation of any provision of
5 section 10a-79, 10a-84, 10a-92 or 10a-139, subsection (a) of section 14-
6 13, section 14-18, section 14-39 so far as it relates to the registration of
7 motor vehicles, section 14-80, sections 14-80b, 14-80h, 14-80i and 14-99f,
8 sections 14-96a to 14-96aa, inclusive, or section 14-228, 14-251, 14-252,
9 14-260 or 14-267a.

10 (b) Whenever there occurs a violation of section 10a-79, 10a-92, 10a-
11 139, 14-218a, 14-219, 14-222, 14-223, 14-224 or 14-253a, [or] sections 14-
12 275 to 14-281, inclusive, or section 14-299 or a violation of an
13 ordinance, bylaw or regulation of any town, city or borough in regard
14 to parking, proof of the registration number of any motor vehicle
15 therein concerned shall be prima facie evidence in any criminal action

16 or in any action based on an infraction that the owner was the operator
17 thereof, except in the case of a leased or rented motor vehicle, such
18 proof shall be prima facie evidence in any criminal action that the
19 lessee was the operator thereof.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:		
Section 1	October 1, 2005	14-107

Statement of Purpose:

To establish a presumption that the registered owner of a motor vehicle is the operator thereof if such motor vehicle is observed or photographed running a red light or otherwise violating a traffic control signal.
