AN ACT CONCERNING THE AWARDING OF EDUCATION DOCTORAL DEGREES BY THE CONNECTICUT STATE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 That sections 10a-87 and 10a-149 of the general statutes be amended
- 2 to give the Connecticut State Universities the authority to award
- 3 education doctoral degrees.

Statement of Purpose:

To make the pilot program under section 4 of public act 01-141 that allows the Connecticut State Universities to award education doctoral degrees a permanent program.
