AN ACT CONCERNING THE DISCLOSURE OF THE RESIDENTIAL ADDRESSES OF NONELECTED PUBLIC OFFICIALS OR EMPLOYEES UNDER THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Section 1-217 of the general statutes is repealed and the
2 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective from passage*):

3 (a) No public agency may disclose, under the Freedom of
4 Information Act, the residential address of any [of the following
5 persons:

6 (1) A federal court judge, federal court magistrate, judge of the
7 Superior Court, Appellate Court or Supreme Court of the state, or
8 family support magistrate;

9 (2) A sworn member of a municipal police department or a sworn
10 member of the Division of State Police within the Department of Public
11 Safety;

12 (3) An employee of the Department of Correction;

13 (4) An attorney-at-law who represents or has represented the state
14 in a criminal prosecution;

15 (5) An attorney-at-law who is or has been employed by the Public
16 Defender Services Division or a social worker who is employed by the
17 Public Defender Services Division;

18 (6) An inspector employed by the Division of Criminal Justice;

19 (7) A firefighter;

20 (8) An employee of the Department of Children and Families;

21 (9) A member of the Board of Pardons and Paroles;

22 (10) An employee of the judicial branch; or

23 (11) A member or employee of the Commission on Human Rights
24 and Opportunities] nonelected public official or public employee.

25 (b) The business address of any [person described in this section]
26 nonelected public official or public employee shall be subject to
27 disclosure under section 1-210. The provisions of this section shall not
28 apply to Department of Motor Vehicles records described in section 14-
29 10.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

Statement of Purpose:

To prohibit the disclosure of the residential addresses of nonelected public officials or public employees under the Freedom of Information Act.
