AN ACT CONCERNING THE AVAILABILITY OF RENTAL ASSISTANCE CERTIFICATES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective July 1, 2005*) (a) During the fiscal year ending on
2 June 30, 2006, the Commissioner of Social Services shall increase the
3 number of rental assistance certificates available under the program
4 established by section 17b-812 of the general statutes, to two thousand
5 fifty, and during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2007, the commissioner
6 shall increase the number of rental assistance certificates available to
7 two thousand six hundred.

8 (b) The sum of two million two hundred thirty-five thousand seven
9 hundred fifty dollars is appropriated to the Department of Social
10 Services, from the General Fund, for the fiscal year ending June 30,
11 2006, for the purpose of increasing the number of such rental
12 assistance certificates.

13 (c) The sum of six million seven hundred seven thousand seven
14 hundred fifty dollars is appropriated to the Department of Social
15 Services, from the General Fund, for the fiscal year ending June 30,

16 2007, for the purpose of increasing the number of such rental
17 assistance certificates.

18 (d) Sums appropriated pursuant to subsections (b) and (c) of this
19 section shall be in addition to sums appropriated in said fiscal years
20 for the maintenance of current services in such program during the
21 fiscal year ending June 30, 2005.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

To phase-in restoration of the service level of the rental assistance program to the 1990 fiscal year level.
