**"AN ACT CONCERNING IMPACT STATEMENTS FOR
REDUCTIONS IN STATE SERVICES AND ADVANCE LEGISLATIVE
APPROVAL FOR SIGNIFICANT PROGRAMMATIC IMPACTS."**

1 Strike everything after the enacting clause and substitute the
2 following in lieu thereof:

3 "Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective July 1, 2005*) (a) There is established a
4 State Employee Workforce Productivity Council charged with the duty
5 of finding ways to increase the productivity of the workforce that the
6 state employs by measuring outcomes and increasing the use of
7 technology and automated systems.

8 (b) The council shall consist of ten members, including: (1) Six
9 representatives from the private sector with expertise in automated
10 processes management and productivity analysis, one of whom shall
11 be appointed by the speaker of the House of Representatives, one of
12 whom shall be appointed by the president pro tempore of the Senate,
13 one of whom shall be appointed by the majority leader of the House of
14 Representatives, one of whom shall be appointed by the majority

15 leader of the Senate, one of whom shall be appointed by the minority
 16 leader of the House of Representatives and one of whom shall be
 17 appointed by the minority leader of the Senate; (2) the Secretary of the
 18 Office of Policy and Management, (3) the Chief Information Officer of
 19 the Department of Information Technology, (4) the Commissioner of
 20 Administrative Services, and (5) the Comptroller.

21 (c) All appointments to the task force shall be made no later than
 22 October 1, 2005. Any vacancy shall be filled by the appointing
 23 authority. At its first meeting, the task force shall elect the chairperson
 24 from among its members.

25 (e) Not later than January 1, 2006, and annually thereafter, the task
 26 force shall submit a report on its findings and recommendations to the
 27 joint standing committee of the General Assembly having cognizance
 28 of matters relating to labor and government administration and
 29 elections, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the
 30 general statutes."

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
