The Committee on Judiciary reported through REP. LAWLOR of the 99th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the House, that the bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING COMPENSATION FOR SMALL CLAIMS AND MOTOR VEHICLE MAGISTRATES AND VICTIM COMPENSATION COMMISSIONERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Section 51-193r of the general statutes is repealed and the
2 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1, 2006*):

3 Each commissioner of the Superior Court shall receive, for acting as
4 a magistrate [in accordance with the provisions of sections] pursuant
5 to section 51-193t [and] or 51-193u, the sum of [one hundred fifty] two
6 hundred dollars for each day [he] the commissioner is engaged as a
7 magistrate.

8 Sec. 2. Subsection (d) of section 54-202 of the general statutes is
9 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July*
10 *1, 2006*):

11 (d) Each victim compensation commissioner and temporary victim
12 compensation commissioner shall receive one hundred [twenty-five]

13 fifty dollars for each day of service.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

Sec. 2	<i>July 1, 2006</i>	54-202(d)

**AN ACT CONCERNING COMPENSATION FOR SMALL CLAIMS
AND MOTOR VEHICLE MAGISTRATES AND VICTIM
COMPENSATION COMMISSIONERS.**

SUMMARY:

This bill increases the per diem from (1) \$150 to \$200 for small claims and motor vehicle magistrates and (2) \$125 to \$150 for victim compensation and temporary victim compensation commissioners.
