"AN ACT CONCERNING THE PHOTOGRAPHIC IMAGE REQUIREMENT ON STANDARD IDENTIFICATION CARDS."

1 After the last section, add the following and renumber sections and
2 internal references accordingly:

3 "Sec. 501. (NEW) (*Effective July 1, 2006*) (a) The State Police Bureau of
4 Identification may maintain the fingerprints of arrested persons
5 received pursuant to section 29-12 of the 2006 supplement to the
6 general statutes, as amended by this act, and of persons who have
7 submitted fingerprints in connection with a criminal history records
8 check pursuant to section 29-17a of the 2006 supplement to the general
9 statutes in an electronic format in lieu of a paper format.

10 (b) Whenever the bureau converts fingerprints contained in its files
11 from a paper format to an electronic format, it may destroy the paper
12 copy of such fingerprints.

13 Sec. 502. Section 29-15 of the general statutes is repealed and the
14 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1, 2006*):

15 (a) [On or after October 1, 1974, when] (1) Except as provided in
16 subdivision (2) of this subsection, whenever any person, having no
17 record of prior criminal conviction, whose fingerprints, [and pictures]
18 photograph and physical description are so filed has been found not
19 guilty of the offense charged, or has had such charge dismissed or
20 nolle, [his] such person's fingerprints, [pictures] photograph and
21 physical description and other identification data and all copies and
22 duplicates thereof, shall, be returned to [him] such person not later
23 than sixty days after the finding of not guilty or after such dismissal or
24 in the case of a nolle within sixty days after thirteen months of such
25 nolle.

26 (2) Whenever any person, having no record of prior criminal
27 conviction, whose fingerprints, photograph and physical description
28 and other identification data has been filed and stored in an electronic
29 format, has been found not guilty of the offense charged, or has had
30 such charge dismissed or nolle, such electronically stored images and
31 data shall be permanently deleted and any paper copy of such
32 fingerprints, photograph and physical description and other
33 identification data, and all copies and duplicates thereof, shall be
34 destroyed not later than sixty days after the finding of not guilty or
35 after such dismissal or in the case of a nolle within sixty days after
36 thirteen months of such nolle.

37 (b) Any person having no record of prior criminal conviction whose
38 fingerprints and pictures are so filed, who has been found not guilty of
39 the offense charged or has had such charge dismissed or nolle prior
40 to October 1, 1974, may, upon application to the person charged with
41 the retention and control of such identification data at the State Police
42 Bureau of Identification, have his fingerprints, pictures and description
43 and other identification data and all copies and duplicates thereof,
44 returned to him not later than sixty days after the filing of such
45 application provided in the case of a nolle, such nolle shall have
46 occurred thirteen months prior to filing of such application."
