"AN ACT CONCERNING AN EMERGENCY PROTOCOL."

1 After the last section, add the following and renumber sections and
2 internal references accordingly:

3 "Sec. 501. Section 5-164a of the 2006 supplement to the general
4 statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof
5 (*Effective from passage*):

6 (a) Any person who has retired from the service of the state under
7 any provision of this chapter and who is reemployed on a permanent
8 basis may elect, upon completion of not less than six months of
9 continuous service of reemployment or other state service, to make
10 contributions to the retirement fund and resume membership in the
11 retirement system. He may also elect to obtain credit for service for the
12 period between the date of such reemployment or other state service
13 and the date of such election, provided he shall contribute to the
14 retirement fund for each month of such service a sum equal to the total
15 contributions he would have paid if he had been a member of the

16 retirement system during such period. Such payment shall be made
17 within six months of the date on which his contributions to the
18 retirement fund are resumed.

19 (b) Any person who has retired from the service of the state under
20 any provision of this chapter and who is elected to serve in the General
21 Assembly may elect, effective from the first day of his term of office, to
22 make contributions to the retirement fund and resume membership in
23 the retirement system.

24 (c) No member reemployed under this section or under section 5-
25 164, as amended, or elected to serve in the General Assembly or
26 otherwise reentering state service shall receive a retirement income
27 during such member's reemployment or other state service except (1) if
28 such member's services as an employee are rendered for not more than
29 [ninety] one hundred twenty working days in any one calendar year,
30 provided that any member reemployed for a period of more than
31 [ninety] one hundred twenty working days in one calendar year shall
32 reimburse the state retirement fund for retirement income payments
33 received during such [ninety] one hundred twenty working days; (2) if
34 such member's services are as a member of the General Assembly or as
35 a sessional employee of the General Assembly during the regular
36 legislative session, such member's retirement income payments shall
37 not be suspended; or (3) if such member's preretirement services which
38 counted towards retirement are other than as a special deputy sheriff
39 pursuant to chapter 78, and if such member's postretirement services
40 are as a special deputy sheriff or, on and after December 1, 2000, as a
41 judicial marshal and such member was employed as a special deputy
42 sheriff on July 1, 1999. Subject to the provisions of this subsection, a
43 retiree may work an indeterminate number of calendar years for the
44 Department of Public Safety at the discretion of such department,
45 without impairing such retiree's pension rights.

46 (d) Upon the subsequent retirement of a member who has made an
47 election under subsection (a) of this section, or upon the expiration of
48 the term of office of a member of the General Assembly who has made

49 an election under subsection (b) of this section, his retirement income
50 shall be recomputed on the basis of his total period of credited state
51 service, excluding any period for which a retirement salary was paid
52 under subdivision (1) or (2) of subsection (c) of this section, and with
53 his base salary recomputed on the basis of his three highest-paid years
54 of his total state service."
