1 Strike everything after the enacting clause and substitute the  
2 following in lieu thereof:

3 "Section 1. Subsection (e) of section 10a-105 of the 2006 supplement  
4 to the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in  
5 lieu thereof (*Effective from passage*):

6 (e) Said board of trustees shall waive the payment of tuition fees at  
7 The University of Connecticut (1) for any dependent child of a person  
8 whom the armed forces of the United States has declared to be missing  
9 in action or to have been a prisoner of war while serving in such armed  
10 forces after January 1, 1960, which child has been accepted for  
11 admission to The University of Connecticut and is a resident of  
12 Connecticut at the time such child is accepted for admission to said

13 institution, (2) for any veteran having served in time of war, as defined  
14 in subsection (a) of section 27-103, or who served in either a combat or  
15 combat support role in the invasion of Grenada, October 25, 1983, to  
16 December 15, 1983, the invasion of Panama, December 20, 1989, to  
17 January 31, 1990, or the peace-keeping mission in Lebanon, September  
18 29, 1982, to March 30, 1984, who has been accepted for admission to  
19 said institution and is domiciled in this state at the time such veteran is  
20 accepted for admission to said institution, (3) for any resident of  
21 Connecticut sixty-two years of age or older who has been accepted for  
22 admission to said institution, provided (A) such person is enrolled in a  
23 degree-granting program, or (B) at the end of the regular registration  
24 period, there are enrolled in the course a sufficient number of students  
25 other than those persons eligible for waivers pursuant to this  
26 subdivision to offer the course in which such person intends to enroll  
27 and there is space available in such course after accommodating all  
28 such students, (4) for any active member of the Connecticut Army or  
29 Air National Guard who (A) has been certified by the Adjutant  
30 General or such Adjutant General's designee as a member in good  
31 standing of the guard, and (B) is enrolled or accepted for admission to  
32 said institution on a full-time or part-time basis in an undergraduate  
33 degree-granting program, (5) for any dependent child of a (A) police  
34 officer, as defined in section 7-294a, as amended, or supernumerary or  
35 auxiliary police officer, (B) firefighter, as defined in section 7-323j, or  
36 member of a volunteer fire company, (C) municipal employee, or (D)  
37 state employee, as defined in section 5-154, killed in the line of duty,  
38 [and] (6) for any resident of the state who is the dependent child or  
39 surviving spouse of a specified terrorist victim who was a resident of  
40 the state, and (7) for any dependent child of a resident of the state who  
41 was killed in a multivehicle crash at or near the intersection of Routes  
42 44 and 10 and Nod Road in Avon on July 29, 2005. If any person who  
43 receives a tuition waiver in accordance with the provisions of this  
44 subsection also receives educational reimbursement from an employer,  
45 such waiver shall be reduced by the amount of such educational  
46 reimbursement. Veterans described in subdivision (2) of this  
47 subsection and members of the National Guard described in

48 subdivision (4) of this subsection shall be given the same status as  
49 students not receiving tuition waivers in registering for courses at The  
50 University of Connecticut. Notwithstanding the provisions of section  
51 10a-30, as used in this subsection, "domiciled in this state" includes  
52 domicile for less than one year.

54 general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu  
55 thereof (*Effective from passage*):

56 (d) Said board shall waive the payment of tuition fees at the  
57 Connecticut State University system (1) for any dependent child of a  
58 person whom the armed forces of the United States has declared to be  
59 missing in action or to have been a prisoner of war while serving in  
60 such armed forces after January 1, 1960, which child has been accepted  
61 for admission to such institution and is a resident of Connecticut at the  
62 time such child is accepted for admission to such institution, (2) for  
63 any veteran having served in time of war, as defined in subsection (a)  
64 of section 27-103, or who served in either a combat or combat support  
65 role in the invasion of Grenada, October 25, 1983, to December 15,  
66 1983, the invasion of Panama, December 20, 1989, to January 31, 1990,  
67 or the peace-keeping mission in Lebanon, September 29, 1982, to  
68 March 30, 1984, who has been accepted for admission to such  
69 institution and is domiciled in this state at the time such veteran is  
70 accepted for admission to such institution, (3) for any resident of  
71 Connecticut sixty-two years of age or older who has been accepted for  
72 admission to such institution, provided (A) such person is enrolled in a  
73 degree-granting program, or (B) at the end of the regular registration  
74 period, there are enrolled in the course a sufficient number of students  
75 other than those persons eligible for waivers pursuant to this  
76 subdivision to offer the course in which such person intends to enroll  
77 and there is space available in such course after accommodating all  
78 such students, (4) for any student attending the Connecticut Police  
79 Academy who is enrolled in a law enforcement program at said  
80 academy offered in coordination with the university which accredits  
81 courses taken in such program, (5) for any active member of the

82 Connecticut Army or Air National Guard who (A) has been certified  
83 by the Adjutant General or such Adjutant General's designee as a  
84 member in good standing of the guard, and (B) is enrolled or accepted  
85 for admission to such institution on a full-time or part-time basis in an  
86 undergraduate degree-granting program, (6) for any dependent child  
87 of a (A) police officer, as defined in section 7-294a, as amended, or  
88 supernumerary or auxiliary police officer, (B) firefighter, as defined in  
89 section 7-323j, or member of a volunteer fire company, (C) municipal  
90 employee, or (D) state employee, as defined in section 5-154, killed in  
91 the line of duty, [and] (7) for any resident of this state who is a  
92 dependent child or surviving spouse of a specified terrorist victim who  
93 was a resident of the state, and (8) for any dependent child of a  
94 resident of the state who was killed in a multivehicle crash at or near  
95 the intersection of Routes 44 and 10 and Nod Road in Avon on July 29,  
96 2005. If any person who receives a tuition waiver in accordance with  
97 the provisions of this subsection also receives educational  
98 reimbursement from an employer, such waiver shall be reduced by the  
99 amount of such educational reimbursement. Veterans described in  
100 subdivision (2) of this subsection and members of the National Guard  
101 described in subdivision (5) of this subsection shall be given the same  
102 status as students not receiving tuition waivers in registering for  
103 courses at Connecticut state universities. Notwithstanding the  
104 provisions of section 10a-30, as used in this subsection, "domiciled in  
105 this state" includes domicile for less than one year.

107 general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu  
108 thereof (*Effective from passage*):

109 (d) Said board of trustees shall waive the payment of tuition at any  
110 of the regional community-technical colleges (1) for any dependent  
111 child of a person whom the armed forces of the United States has  
112 declared to be missing in action or to have been a prisoner of war  
113 while serving in such armed forces after January 1, 1960, which child  
114 has been accepted for admission to such institution and is a resident of  
115 Connecticut at the time such child is accepted for admission to such

116 institution, (2) for any veteran having served in time of war, as defined  
117 in subsection (a) of section 27-103, or who served in either a combat or  
118 combat support role in the invasion of Grenada, October 25, 1983, to  
119 December 15, 1983, the invasion of Panama, December 20, 1989, to  
120 January 31, 1990, or the peace-keeping mission in Lebanon, September  
121 29, 1982, to March 30, 1984, who has been accepted for admission to  
122 such institution and is domiciled in this state at the time such veteran  
123 is accepted for admission to such institution, (3) for any resident of  
124 Connecticut sixty-two years of age or older, provided, at the end of the  
125 regular registration period, there are enrolled in the course a sufficient  
126 number of students other than those persons eligible for waivers  
127 pursuant to this subdivision to offer the course in which such person  
128 intends to enroll and there is space available in such course after  
129 accommodating all such students, (4) for any student attending the  
130 Connecticut State Police Academy who is enrolled in a law  
131 enforcement program at said academy offered in coordination with a  
132 regional community-technical college which accredits courses taken in  
133 such program, (5) for any active member of the Connecticut Army or  
134 Air National Guard who (A) has been certified by the Adjutant  
135 General or such Adjutant General's designee as a member in good  
136 standing of the guard, and (B) is enrolled or accepted for admission to  
137 such institution on a full-time or part-time basis in an undergraduate  
138 degree-granting program, (6) for any dependent child of a (A) police  
139 officer, as defined in section 7-294a, as amended, or supernumerary or  
140 auxiliary police officer, (B) firefighter, as defined in section 7-323j, or  
141 member of a volunteer fire company, (C) municipal employee, or (D)  
142 state employee, as defined in section 5-154, killed in the line of duty,  
143 [and] (7) for any resident of the state who is a dependent child or  
144 surviving spouse of a specified terrorist victim who was a resident of  
145 this state, and (8) for any dependent child of a resident of the state who  
146 was killed in a multivehicle crash at or near the intersection of Routes  
147 44 and 10 and Nod Road in Avon on July 29, 2005. If any person who  
148 receives a tuition waiver in accordance with the provisions of this  
149 subsection also receives educational reimbursement from an employer,  
150 such waiver shall be reduced by the amount of such educational

151 reimbursement. Veterans described in subdivision (2) of this  
152 subsection and members of the National Guard described in  
153 subdivision (5) of this subsection shall be given the same status as  
154 students not receiving tuition waivers in registering for courses at  
155 regional community-technical colleges. Notwithstanding the  
156 provisions of section 10a-30, as used in this subsection, "domiciled in  
157 this state" includes domicile for less than one year."
